Sports Premium Impact Statement Cherry Oak School

In the 2013-2014 academic year Cherry Oak received £8,270 in order to improve our sport provision for our pupils. We evaluated our current provision and planned for key areas to improve the quality of sport and PE opportunities available for our pupils.

Below is a summary of our impact statement for each key area of improvement for 2013-2014:

1) To increase the opportunities of swimming for Early Years pupils

Pupils in our Early Years Foundation Stage have had swimming lessons on a rotation basis throughout the year. They have increased their water confidence and stroke skills evidenced in outstanding PE lesson observation Summer Term 2014. (Spend £1,300 Early Years swimming sessions, £542 swimming and sports kits)

2) To improve swimming teaching across the school

Two members of staff have undertaken swimming teacher's external training. This learning has been brought back into school and the impact of this has been lesson observations that have demonstrated a higher level of teaching of the subject area. (Spend £310 swimming teacher's course & cover)

3) To give pupils increased opportunities for Outdoor and Adventurous Activities

Pupils have had extended opportunities to experience OAA. These have included sessions to Blackwell Activity Centre and rock climbing. Pupils and staff feedback has been very positive. Pupils have increased their confidence in rock climbing and this is evidenced in their ability to climb. (Spend £500 Blackwell Activity Centre & £500 Rock Climbing)

4) To increase competitive sporting opportunities for pupils

There has been a significant increase in competitive sporting opportunities for pupils both in and out of school. The following list

outlines how many pupils have taken part in competitive events outside of school.

A total of 32 pupils have participated in Competitive sports externally. Internally 100% of pupils have taken part in competitive sporting opportunities in each term.

5) To give pupils the experience of a wider range of sporting activities across the Federation.

All pupils took part in a week-long Sports and Arts week across the Federation with our partner school Victoria. A diverse range of sporting activities were organised which included climbing walls, rodeos, assault courses, competitive sports both across the Federation and externally to name but a few. The feedback and evaluations from pupils and staff were tremendous. Pupils increased their knowledge and experience in a range of sporting activities. Pupils increased their confidence whilst taking part in activities and the level of challenge enabled individuals to achieve sporting achievement beyond what would normally be expected. (Spend £3,074)
