

## 2014 - 2015 Sports Premium Impact Statement Cherry Oak School

In the 2014-2015 academic year Cherry Oak received £8,097 in order to improve our sport provision for our pupils. We evaluated our current provision and planned for key areas to improve the quality of sport and PE opportunities available for our pupils.

Below is a summary of our impact statement for each key area of improvement for 2014-2015:

### **1) To offer increased sports coach led sessions**

Aspire Sports delivered lunchtime sporting clubs for all pupils increasing the range and skill level of pupils. Coached sessions were delivered in the afternoons for identified pupils. The sessions formed part of a mentoring and coaching model for our Specialist PE practitioner. This has led to improved PE outcomes for pupils evidenced in outstanding lesson observations.

### **2) To increase the of external competitive events & to extend the Federation sports teams and events**

Increased competitive external sporting opportunities, 8 pupils Birmingham School games finalists, 8 pupils Kwik Cricket, 8 pupils PARA Athletics 6<sup>th</sup> Place. Extended range of internal competitive sporting activities including 79 pupils took part in the Africa Sports Day linked to Spring Term Topic. Pupils enjoyed being part of a team a competing for their school. They also competed individually and earned medals for their own performance. They gained an understanding of how to improve their own personal performance as well as being part of a team and how they can impact on their team placing.

### **3) To increase opportunities for alternative sporting activities.**

Increased opportunities to a variety of sporting activities, increased opportunities to undertake new activities, increased individual pupil confidence, personal enjoyment and achievement for all participating pupils. Golf 16 pupils, 10 pupils rock climbing, horse-riding 6 pupils and sailing 8 pupils.
